Training Flow & Timeline

Total Duration: 30 minutes

Time Breakdown for Blind Drawing

- $\circ~$ 5 minutes for setting the stage and dividing into pairs
- 15 minutes of drawing time
- 10 minutes for debrief and sharing drawings

Rules for the Blind Drawing



- No Peeking: The drawer cannot see the image or object they are supposed to draw.
- Clear Communication is Key: The describer can only use verbal instructions; no gestures or pointing allowed.
- **Time Limit**: Each pair has a set amount of time to complete their drawing.

Step-by-step Guide to Blind Drawing

Step 1: Pair Up

Activity: Form pairs, deciding who will draw and who will

describe first.

Time: 5 minutes

Step 2: Setup

Activity: Give the describer their image or object.

Time: 2 minutes

Step 3: The Drawing Begins

Activity: Without seeing the image/object, the drawer begins to

draw based on their partner's descriptions.

Time: 15 minutes

Step 4: The Big Reveal

Activity: Compare the drawings to the original images/objects.

Time: 3 minutes



Step 5: Switch Roles

Activity: Swap roles and repeat the process for fairness and

double the fun.

Time: 15 minutes

Key Learnings & Takeaways

Discover the power of precise communication and the humor in misunderstanding. This challenge sheds light on the need for clarity, patience, and the ability to listen and adapt.

Next Steps
